### **Introductory Details...**

The best way to interpret just about any passage of Scripture is to think of it like a 3-layer cake...

#### **#1 – “What does this passage teach me about God?”**

Exodus points us to the Fatherhood of God. A big theme in Exodus is our Father God delivering His son, Israel, out of Egypt. (Exodus 4:22-23)

#### **#2 – “What does this passage teach me about the history of God's people?”**

For millennia, God has been faithful to keep His promises to His people. Moses' ancestral fathers are living proof. (Exodus 3:6, 13-17; 4:5; 15:2)

#### **#3 – “What are the details of this passage and how can I apply it to my life?”**

Exodus contains 31 references to fathers and fatherhood. Just as other parts of the Bible call mothers to raise their children in the faith, Exodus particularly calls fathers to this task.
