### ***What true story does this passage tell?***

Moses was more interested in making heroes out of others than being a hero himself. (cf. [Exodus 35:30-36:2](#); [1 Chronicles 2:18-19](#); [1 Corinthians 3:1-23](#); [1 Timothy 4:12](#))

### ***Ask yourself:***

“Do I want to be a hero or a hero-maker?”

### ***Why does god invite us to be hero-makers instead of heroes?***

#1 – Hero-makers have discovered that dying to self and living for God’s kingdom through others is the secret of multiplied results and greater impact. ([Exodus 35:34](#); cf. [Matthew 6:33](#); [John 12:24](#); [2 Timothy 2:2](#))

#2 – Hero-makers find the greatest joy in making others the hero in God’s unfolding story. (cf. [Matthew 9:37-38](#))

#3 – Hero-makers realize that Jesus is the only true hero. (cf. [Proverbs 3:19-20](#); [Matthew 2:13-23](#); [13:54-55](#); [16:18](#); [Mark 6:3](#); [John 14:1-3](#); [Philippians 2:1-11](#); [Revelation 21-22](#))

#4 – Hero-makers are convinced that Jesus loves to make heroes out of others. (cf. [Matthew 4:19](#); [28:18-20](#); [Mark 1:17](#); [3:13-14](#); [John 3:22](#); [14:12](#); [20:21](#))
