A. Love Redefined (Deuteronomy 6:4-5; Mark 12:30-31 NLT)

- We love our neighbor (*John 13:34*; *15:12-13*)
 - a. As we love ourselves
 - b. At the expense of ourselves
 - c. To the death of ourselves

B. Love Demonstrated (Romans 5:6, 8)

C. Love Resurrected

- 1. Internal Motivation He had compassion, love, and empathy. (<u>2 Corinthians 1:3-4</u>; <u>1 John 4:19</u>)
- 2. External Motivation For the joy set before Him. (*John 15:10-15; 1 Corinthians 6:14; 15:51-52; Hebrews 12:2*)
 - a. On the other side of the cross He could see joy. He laid down His life knowing joy was on the other side.
 - b. Love displayed at His expense would lead to forever joy with the Father.
 - c. The life that He laid down was raised three days later. (<u>Matthew</u> 28:2-5)
 - d. Jesus was raised from the dead, glorified, and sits at the right hand of the Father. (*Hebrews 1:3*)
 - e. He laid down His life in our place that a way might be made. Forgiveness can be graciously given to all who believe.
 - f. Joy was not experienced by avoiding pain, it was experienced by going through it for our sake.
 - e. It is one of the great paradoxes of the Christian faith: Through temporal pain Jesus now experiences eternal joy. It will be the same for us!

The <u>joy</u> that Jesus is experiencing right now is the joy that we will experience with Him for eternity!

A life laid down for the sake of others is a life filled with the joy of Jesus.
