#### Prayer was connected to the spread of the Gospel.

- Acts 4:31 (vv. 23-30 The prayer)
- Acts 10 vv. 1-2 Cornelius, who prayed continually...
  - v. 9 Peter, in a time set aside to pray...
  - v. 30 Answered prayers
  - vv. **34-48** Peter preaches the Gospel, they believe and receive the Holy Spirit, and they are baptized!

#### **Prayer for healing**

- · Acts 9:40
- Acts 28:8 For signs and wonders

#### Prayer in times of persecution and need

- Acts 12:5-10 Peter imprisoned
- Acts 16:25-30 Persecution and propagation work together through prayer
- Acts 20:36 When departing from a church he had planted
- Acts 21:5 When commending Paul to a dangerous situation and certain imprisonment for the sake of the gospel

#### **Practical Takeaways**

Consistently pray with others.

- · There are natural moments.
- Prayer does not have to be extended or awkward.
- If you are in public, do you have to close your eyes? Is the waiter standing, staring, and waiting on you?


