 $\mbox{\bf Grow}$ - (and I will make you) We build HABITS by always taking our next step of growth.




God Creates

God **beside** us! God created all things—including mankind—in His own image to have a relationship with Him. Genesis 1, Colossians 1:15-17, Psalm 139




Sin Breaks

God **against** us! Sin broke our relationship, and we are enemies and hostile toward God, separated from Him. *Romans 3:10, 3:23, 5:8, Colossians 1:21*



Jesus Saves

God *in* us! Jesus died on the cross for our sins and rose from the dead. He forgives and saves all who place their faith in Him and gives them the Holy Spirit. *Ephesians 2:8-9, Romans 10:9-10*



Jesus offers salvation to all who believe in Him. You can express your faith by praying to Him now... "Jesus, I have sinned against you and ask for your forgiveness. I believe you died on the cross for my sins and rose from the dead."

Jesus Transforms

Grow

Jesus transforms us through a process of growth throughout our lives. The way we consistently spend our time and engage with God and others form our habits. Growth takes place as we break bad habits and build healthy habits. It has been said,

"Shape your habits and then your habits will shape you."

The Bible speaks to our priorities and values. At Bible Center, we use the acronym, **HABITS**, to focus on six ways to grow. As we grow, our love for God, one another, and our neighbors will become more evident in our actions, desires, and words.

We grow by taking steps to build biblical HABITS. In this booklet, the HABITS are defined and described. A couple of devotionals, developmental resources, and opportunities are also included.

Our **HABITS** Assessment is available to help you determine which HABITS are going well and which could use some attention and growth (pg. 23).





My Next Steps

How Do We Grow?

Jesus Transforms

We can plant seeds and water, but it is Jesus who causes the growth (1 Corinthians 3:5-6). As we behold Him, He transforms us (2 Corinthians 3:18). Spiritual growth is never something we accomplish on our own (Galatians 3:2-3, 1 Peter 4:11). Jesus is the One who saved us and He is the one who will grow us (Philippians 1:6). God is actively at work in our lives (Philippians 2:13). Thankfully, it is Jesus who ultimately transforms His children. Scripture also calls us to action, so we ask the question: *What part do we play in our spiritual growth?*

We Participate

Jesus transforms us through His power and presence, but He also calls for our **participation**. We are responsible for our growth or lack of growth (Hebrews 6:1-6). We are encouraged or cautioned, depending on how we are doing (1 Corinthians 3:1-3). Each Christian is to work (actions) with all of their hearts (motives and desires) for the Lord (Colossians 3:23) in thankfulness and in the name of Jesus (Colossians 3:17). Though the Lord is the One who changes us (Philippians 2:13), we are to work to grow with diligence (Philippians 2:12). We consistently, day after day, present ourselves as living sacrifices to Jesus (Romans 12:1).

- We Have Disciplers Spiritual disciplers and leaders protect and guard the flock (Acts 20:28). Paul labors for others to grow (Galatians 4:19, Colossians 2:1). Paul recognizes his role as an example (1 Corinthians 11:1, Philippians 3:17, 4:9, 1 Thessalonians 3:9). We labor until everyone hears about Jesus and grows to the fullness of maturity in Him (Colossians 1:28-29).
- We Mature A biblical process of growth takes place, which can be described in several ways:
 - a. In 1 Corinthians 3:1-3, some are called carnal, and they are expected to be mature. Instead of spiritual food, they are only able to handle spiritual milk. Paul assesses their maturity and then writes to encourage and warn them to take their next steps of spiritual growth.
 - b. Growth is described as the movement from spiritual infancy to spiritual maturity (Hebrews 5:12-14).
 - c. John addresses people at different levels of spiritual maturity: little children (teknia), children (paida), young men (neaniskos), and fathers (1 John 2:12-14). Each has a particular word given and a

next step to take. The biblical authors **assess** spiritual maturity, **measure** growth, and then **encourage** people to take their next step of growth.

- We Consider "And let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds" (Hebrews 10:24). The ability to truly determine the best way to encourage someone is through knowing and understanding them. Relationships are key in this process. As a spiritual family, as disciplers, and as those needing discipleship, we are to daily consider how to encourage one another toward spiritual growth and increased faith (Hebrews 3:13). Each of us is motivated in different ways based upon our maturity, personality, and stage of life.
- We Assess and Measure Taking time to thoughtfully and honestly consider our strengths and weaknesses is essential in our journey of spiritual growth. HABITS create a grid to ask questions and measure progress. Paul would consistently assess the spiritual health of a church (and often, individuals in a church) and call them to take next steps. Only God knows the heart, so the best thing we can do is point people to actively participate in the life-changing HABITS the Bible gives us for growth. Individuals living out 3 of the HABITS or more are considered actively growing. Jesus wants everyone to be actively growing in the church (Colossians 1:28). The church will seek to measure progress and help more people each year to actively grow!
- We Encourage, Set Goals, and Celebrate Believers are called to encourage one another daily (Hebrews 3:13). This often takes place through quality conversations, setting goals, and celebrating steps of faith. With each step, Jesus receives the credit and gets the glory. Since all of us have different personalities, motivations, and life situations, encouragement and goals may differ. Some may need a group for accountability. Others may want someone to help them verbally process their next step. Some will be intrinsically motivated while others may first need extrinsic motivation to get them going on their journey.
 We seek to provide many opportunities to help you on your journey!

Jesus transforms, and we are called to participate. We journey together.
